



## **What is Sport Premium?**

The government provides additional funding to improve the provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding, provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, is allocated to primary schools.

This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools. Funding for schools is calculated by reference to the number of primary-aged pupils (between the ages of 5 and 11).

## **Purpose of funding as stated by Department for Education 2017:**

- the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity - the Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that all children and young people aged 5 to 18 engage in at least 60 minutes of physical activity a day, of which 30 minutes should be in school
- the profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement
- increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
- broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
- increased participation in competitive sport
