Internet Explorer 8 and Click Clever, Click Safe tools

What is Internet Explorer 8?

Internet Explorer 8 is the latest web browser from Microsoft. **It comes bundled with Windows 7 but does not contain the CEOP controls.** The install process of Windows 7 invites the user to download "Windows Live". This will **not** give you IE8 with the CEOP controls. You need to download this version of the browser yourself from the link on this page

What is "Zip it, Block it, Flag it?"

Zip It- Keep your personal stuff private, and think about what you say and do online.

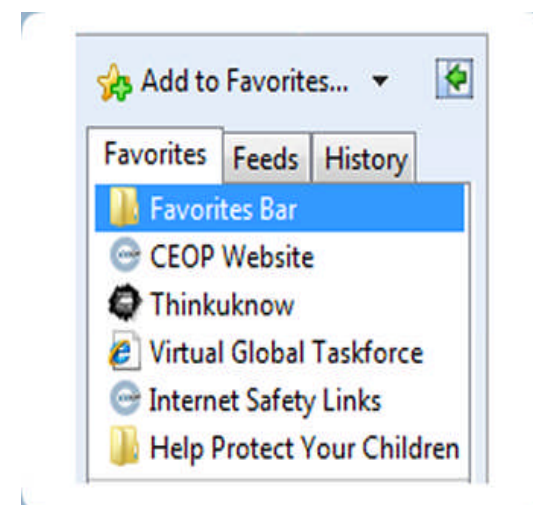
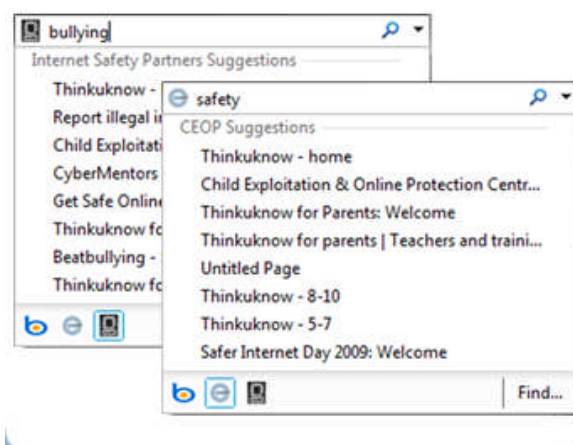
Block it- Block people who send nasty messages and don't open unknown links and attachments.
