## Support for children learning at home

We are so proud of the fantastic learning all the children at home are doing and I know how much they are enjoying the zoom catch up with their friends in class each week. The success of these, means we are not making so many phone calls and we therefore have the capacity to introduce some additional support for children who are not in school.

After half term, teachers will have an extra morning out of class when they will work 1:1, or in a small group, with some of the children who were having additional support in Terms 1 and 2. Mrs Ferguson is already supporting some children in this way. In addition, all teachers, from Year One upwards, will be arranging at least one zoom session each week, when any child who is not in school or having an additional support session, can 'drop in ' to have some 1:1 help about any aspect of their learning they may be struggling with. Class teachers will be in touch with further information about this and will contact parents of any children who will be offered additional support work.
