Attendance

Thank you to everyone who ensure their children attend school as much as they can. Attendance remains a focus of the DfE, and how well schools manage and encourage attendance is scrutinised at several levels beyond the school itself. We have set a whole school target of 96% and at the moment we are just meeting it with 96.4% to date. Some children struggle emotionally to come to school; if this is affecting your child's attendance, please do talk to us - we are here to help.

Thanks to the generosity our parents and carers of Owls 2025, we now have a lovely new bench on the playground. Pupils can use this at breaktimes when they prefer to do a quiet activity, or just sit and chat. It has the added bonus of being fully inclusive, with access for a wheelchair.

At Wivelsfield we are proud of helping our children to understand the importance of supporting the wider community.

This term, rather than holding a coffee morning, we held a cake sale after school for McMillan, where we raised £221. Thank you to everyone who made or bought cakes and biscuits for the sale.

A couple of weeks later, we celebrated harvest, with different assemblies for our younger and older children. At these assemblies, the children brought their harvest gifts to the hall where they performed songs and poems related to autumn and harvest. Well done to all our young performers, and especially to our new Robins for being so confident after just a few weeks in school. Thank you to all of you for your generous gifts which, this year, were donated to Haywards Heath Community Foodbank.
